The day may come where you are a full time caregiver or know someone who is. I found a great book for beginners. It could be called Caregivers 101. It was written by Bruce Willis's wife, Emma Heming Willis. Bruce has (Frontotemporal dementia) FTD, but the book has principles for any type of dementia or caregiving need. I figured she had the money to find experts and she did. I found the book at Barnes and Noble. It is half price on-line right now. The name of the book is *The Unexpected Journey*.

It talks about the process of dementia decline but the most important chapters in my thinking are about taking care of yourself so you can take care of someone else. It speaks of the importance of having community and taking time for yourself so you don't burn out or neglect your own health. It has a chapter on how to speak to your children/grandchildren about the changes happening so it isn't so scary for them. It is not a Christian book. We have the added benefit of God's peace and guidance in our lives that Emma does not. It has a lot of good training and advice though.

The year 2025 has come to an end.

I first want to thank our pastors, member churches, and all of our members in the conference for your continued prayers and financial support over the past year. I know it's been a struggle with inflation, forcing each of us to make choices about where our money goes.

In the midst of these challenges, our Conference has accomplished wonderful Kingdom work through our three priorities: Church Development, Church Multiplication, and Conference Care. Church Development continues as we assess where churches are in their life cycle and help them grow and thrive. Our Church Multiplication continues to support and equip our pastors as they plant and replant churches. Our four Regional Pastors also continue to support, care for, encourage, and bless the churches within their regions. These are the things you are resourcing through your generous contributions.

However, as a Conference, we are facing significant resource challenges. Our budgeted giving from member churches was about \$100,000 below budget. In 2025, 60% of our churches contributed to our Conference. I'm grateful for the generosity of each of these churches. However, this means that 40% of our churches made no contribution to support our Conference's three priorities.

I'd like to remind us of our 2% challenge. Each of our churches is encouraged to prayerfully consider setting aside 2% of its annual budget to support the Conference's work. Here's a link to our 2% challenge brochure. We hope to resource and build initiatives in pastoral leadership development in the coming year. Every dollar helps.

In addition to our budget shortfall, our expenses exceeded our budget by over \$90,000. There is a cost to our continued resourcing of our priorities, and as a Conference, we have also experienced the challenges of inflation. In the coming year, we will do our best to manage our budget so that we faithfully steward your generous contributions.

Please join me, our Board, and Staff in praying for our pastors, churches, and our mission within the CCCC.


Choir News
