

Over the past few months, I have had the opportunity to share my work at Black Forest Academy (BFA) at three different churches in Michigan. Preparing for these presentations has given me time to reflect on the why and the what of my work in international Christian education. The why involves supporting global field workers who are declaring the marvelous deeds of the Lord in over 50 countries. Providing education for these students allows several ministries to flourish. It has been a joy to share this aspect of my ministry with people in person here in the US.

The "what" involves helping students and teachers grow in wisdom and understanding. Last year, in my newsletter I shared about the school's new Expected Student Outcomes (ESOs). These are the statements that help the school connect its mission with what takes place in classrooms, dorms, and other activities. These statements summarize a lot of what I do in working with the school's curriculum. You will find a short video explaining the main ideas of the ESOs below.

In addition to speaking at churches, I also had the opportunity to spend a week in Orlando, Florida at the headquarters for Wycliffe USA. This was a good time of interacting with others who are currently in the US, but normally serve in a variety of locations around the world. I was also able to learn more about practical things like health insurance and retirement planning.

As I mentioned in my last newsletter, a part of my time in the US is devoted to rebuilding my prayer and financial partnership team. I have seen some small increases in my financial partnership team. I currently have 80% of the ministry budget that Wycliffe has set for me. I will need to be at 100% by July 2026 in order to return to Germany. Would you prayerfully consider being a part of my Wycliffe financial ministry team? You may use the information at the bottom of the message or contact me directly for ways to give.

As we enter the holiday season, I am reminded of how thankful I am to the Lord for his goodness that has been shown to me. I have seen this through your prayers, encouragement, and financial gifts. I am truly thankful for your partnership with me.

Dementia; Prolonging Independence

Independence is a wonderful asset and freedom is a delicate balance. It is a rewarding effort to maintain these gifts in our lives. Even more so when we can do the same for others when necessary. Having a few years experience with this sort of struggle, we've developed a few strategies for mitigating the risks and trials of diminished awareness as a progressive disease.

Around the house we watch for things that might catch a toe or a spark; cause fall or fire. We avoid rugs and keep floor space open. If something must be out, like a power cord or a favorite doormat, we typically secure it with adhesive and an eye for unintrusiveness.

We put handles near thresholds, steps, or anywhere they might be useful. This is particularly true in the bathroom, where grab bars and traction surfaces can prevent a really bad day. Shower chairs are simple and inexpensive plastic seats to reduce the energy costs of cleanliness. Don't be afraid to insist they try it out if it's been a while, we may have to pick up some hygienic slack as we can bear, but the hospice here is great and will help with that when it becomes vital.

The stove got left on more than once, so a timer operated toaster oven became the main way to heat food for a while. In another case, a battery powered mug and microwave were simultaneously obliterated before being chemically extinguished. We had only recently replaced our kitchen flame response based on the expiration date. We also keep a fire blanket mounted on a wall nearby as backup. Our current microwave has a simple but effective locking function.

After finding some spending directed to deceivers and other evidences of financial susceptibilities, we had to take measures to protect our loved ones from scams, spam, and misleading internet advertisements.

Money alerts were reasonably easy to set up in banking apps to make sure nothing fishy was happening behind anyone's back. While credit cards help keep an eye on spending, we used gift cards where a high limit could have been a concern. Keep a close eye on things, as we've caught funny business quickly in the past and not had issues resolving it with a phone call.

And on phones, spam protection was fairly simple, as both Android and iPhone permit restricting incoming calls to those on the contacts list. In the mailbox, it was just a matter of tossing the junk before delivering to the intended recipient. Online was a bit more of a technically involved approach to optimizing the situations we encountered, but sufficient PC security is reasonably achievable.

We are homebodies and haven't had to worry about wanderers, but we've heard from those who do that GPS tracking tags are cheap and effective. A necklace, bracelet, wallet card or purse dongle can trace a loved ones location with a smartphone. We have found basic compartmented pill holders very useful, but for those in need of more frequent dispensation, automated units are available to ensure proper timing of delivery.

We never stop learning and always enjoy new ideas for old issues as well as how old ideas can solve new issues. The degree to which we have reaped benefit from better ideas might compel us to reach ever higher, for seeing how limitless the opportunity.




