Verses That Help Us Understand the Significance of Motherhood in the Bible

Mothers Are to Be Honored

"Honor your father and your mother, as the Lord your God has commanded you, so that you may live long and that it may go well with you in the land the Lord your God is giving you" (Deuteronomy 5:16).

When you consider the word honor in the Hebrew, it means to give weight to someone. One way you can honor someone is to give them weight in your life. You do this by giving that person respect or authority in your life. When you are younger, a mother is a central authority figure in your life. The respect and honor you show her often shows up in your obedience. As you get older and become an adult, the role of your mother shifts from one of central authority to one of respect in your life. You may no longer be bound to obey, but you are always bound to respect.

Mothers Offer Comfort

"As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you; and you will be comforted over Jerusalem" (Isaiah 66:13).

One of the more significant roles a mother has is to offer comfort. This comfort often comes as nurturing. It is highly proper for mothers to nurture their children. Nurturing can involve a word of encouragement or challenging a child to become who God has created them to be. When done properly, nurturing is an essential part of helping a child to grow healthy.

Jacksonville, Florida, was the site of the Bridges National Staff Conference. It was a blessing to be with fellow staff members from all over the USA and parts of Canada. We were encouraged, challenged, ministered to, connected with old friends, and met many new ones as well. It was also a time of vision casting. Fletcher Maynard, my counterpart National Prayer Champion, led a time of pray for multiplying disciples and we discovered that the places where we currently have fewer multiplying disciples is precisely where we will be sending our staff and international students on summer missions.

The theme was taken from 2 Corinthians 4:7: "But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us." The treasure is the gospel, which is a person, and His name is Jesus. It's a gift given to us from God that is free for us but was very costly for Jesus. Returning from the conference I fell while changing planes in Atlanta. One of my co-workers was with me and we were surrounded by airline personnel and medical people to make sure I was OK. Then on Easter Sunday, my Venezuelan daughter in the faith, Celena, pictured here with me will be baptized on stage at Hill Country Bible Church. I-TEC Update March 2024


Ministering in Papua New Guinea

The other purpose of their time in Papua New Guinea is to do a **survey for a possible future project for Samaritan Aviation**. This ministry helps bring medical care and supplies to people groups throughout the East Sepik Region of Papua New Guinea.
